Proposal for Resident Survey (vLong)

Mission: The goal of this survey is to quantify our residents' sentiments regarding potential budget and mill rate <u>increases changes</u> for <u>FY23FY24</u>.

Process: The survey will be available to Wilton Residents until March 31, 2022TBD[MR1]. The results will be tabulated and analyzed by the Board of Finance before its final budget deliberation on April 4, 2022TBD.

Introduction:

The primary role of Wilton's Board of Finance is to recommend an annual budget to the town's residents. As part of that decision, the Board of Finance must approve and recommend budgets for the Board of Selectman and the Board of Education. These budgets are the primary drivers in the mill rate calculation. Wilton's residents will then vote on the town's budget at the Annual Town Meeting, which this year will be held on Tuesday May 3-X at 7:00pm, with continued voting on Saturday May 7X from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM, at the Clune Center at Wilton High School

To make its recommendation, the Board of Finance is seeking input from the town's residents about the Board of Selectmen's budget, the Board of Education's budget, and the mill rate. While the Board of Finance has line-item authority on the Board of Selectman's budget, it does not have that same authority on the Board of Education's budget. Based on the budgets proposed by the Board of Selectmen (+1.37%X% increase) and the Board of Education (+3.26X% increase), the mill rate would increase +1.94X% [MR3]. Note that some residents may experience tax growth greater than 1.94% due to the increase in the valuation of motor vehicles.
