Chairman Jeff Rutishauser called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Mr. Rutishauser noted that there is a small change in revenues number. He stated that there was a mistake in the calculation of the town revenues that was made the prior evening which resulted in an additional \$110,000 of revenues. He noted that he had "hair-cutted" the revenues for Other Revenues which were Town Of Wilton – owned property, not municipal aid from Hartford. Restoring the full revenue increment of \$110,000 changed the mil rate.

Mr. Creeth noted in light of the additional \$110,000, he proposed that the additional revenue go towards the BoE and to bring the cut to the BoE budget from \$650,000 to \$500,000. Mr. Kalamarides seconded that motion. Discussion ensued with all board members weighing in. The motion to restore \$150,000 to the BoE budget passed 6-0.

Mr. Rutishauser then called for an adjournment to the meeting at 8:17 p.m. Motion moved by Mr. Kress to adjourn.

- Debt Service: Richard Creeth moved and Walter Kress seconded that \$10,921,766 be appropriated for Debt Service.
 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- 3. **Board of Education:** <u>Walter Kress</u> moved and <u>Jeffrey Rutishauser</u> seconded that \$81,876,563 be appropriated for the Board of Education operating budget. Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- 4. **Board of Selectmen Operating:** <u>Jeffrey Rutishauser</u> moved and <u>Peter Balderston</u> seconded that \$32,319,728 be appropriated for the Board of Selectmen's operating budget.

Motion carried 5 in favor, 1 opposed. (Kalamarides)

- Board of Selectmen Capital: <u>Peter Balderston</u> moved and <u>Stewart</u>
 <u>Koenigsberg</u> seconded that \$1,182,271 be appropriated for the Board of Selectmen's capital budget.

 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed
- 6. Charter Authority: <u>Stewart Koenigsberg</u> moved and <u>John Kalamarides</u> seconded that \$1,263,003 be appropriated for the Charter Authority including \$317,001 under the jurisdiction of the Board of Selectmen, and \$947,252 under the jurisdiction of the Board of Finance for Charter Authority.
 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- 7. General Fund Total Operating Budget: John Kalamarides moved and Richard Creeth seconded a motion to recommend to the Annual Town Meeting a Fiscal 2019 General Fund Total Operating budget of \$127,563,331.

 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- 8. Ending Fund Balance: Richard Creeth moved and Walter Kress seconded that the June 30, 2019 estimated General Fund Balance be set at \$12,756,333 which is 10% of the FY19 Total Operating Funds Required. The June 30, 2018 estimated General Fund Balance be set at \$15,762,589 leaving \$3,006,256 to be used to finance the FY19 budget.

 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- Tax Relief: Walter Kress moved and Jeffrey Rutishauser seconded that tax relief for the elderly or disabled be estimated at \$1,150,000 and WVAC/Georgetown at \$20,750.

Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.

- 10. Grand List and Collection Rate: <u>Jeffrey Rutishauser</u> moved and <u>Peter Balderston</u> seconded that the estimated rate of tax collections due on the October 1, 2017 Net Taxable Grand List of \$4,339,653,974 be set at 99.3%. Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
- 11. Mil Rate Levy: Peter Balderston moved and John Kalamarides seconded a motion to levy a tax of 28.1875 mils on the Net Taxable Grand List of October 1, 2017 and that the tax be payable one-half on July 1, 2018 and one-half on January 1, 2019, except for bills of \$100 or less, and for personal property taxes on automobiles, which shall be payable in one installment on July 1, 2018 Motion carried 6 in favor, 0 opposed.
