## BOARD OF FINANCE VOTE ON THE FY 2010 BUDGET Special Meeting of April 9, 2009

Present: Warren Serenbetz, Robert Kelso, Al Alper, Andrew Pforzheimer Excused: Jim Meinhold, Lynne Vanderslice, William Brennan, Ex Officio member

Chairman Serenbetz called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked Mr. Brennan to provide details of the \$150,000 cut in the Board of Selectmen's budget request the Board of Finance voted on at its meeting of April 7.

Mr. Brennan said the Board of Selectmen met on April 8 and unanimously voted on the following reductions:

Mr. Brennan said that, although the Selectmen's vote was unanimous, it was not enthusiastic. He reminded the Board of Finance that when it met with the Board of Education and Board of Selectmen in the summer, the Finance Board expressed a clear preference for "zero budget growth". As originally submitted, the Selectmen's combined FY 10 operating and capital budget was actually 1.4% less than the adopted FY 09 budget. The Selectmen believe that in imposing a further cut of \$150,000, the Board of Finance was denigrating the sacrifices already made by the Town departments.

Chairman Serenbetz then asked for motions on the general fund budget for Fiscal 2010.
