A. Call to Order

Ms. Vanderslice called the meeting to order at 7:03pm.

Ms. Vanderslice moved a motion to add to the agenda an item 6 - Possible Appointment to Fill a Vacancy on the Historic District & Historic Property Commission. Motion seconded by Mr. Tartell and carried 5-0.

B. Executive Session to Discuss Litigation

Ms. Vanderslice asked for a motion to enter into Executive Session at 7:05pm to Discuss Litigation Pal v Cipolla et. al and invite attorneys Tallberg and Bloom into the session. Motion moved by Mr. Cole seconded by Ms. Healy and carried 5-0.

Out of Executive Session and back in Regular Session at 8:02pm.

E. Discussion and/or Action

1. Approval of 2023 Annual Town Meeting and Adjourned Vote Dates Ms. Vanderslice asked for a motion to approve the Annual Town Meeting date of May 2nd and May 6th for the adjourned vote. Motion to set the Annual Town Meeting as Tuesday May 2, 2023 and the Adjourned Vote as Saturday May 6, 2023 moved by Ms. Healy. Motion seconded by Mr. Cole and carried 5-0.

2. Verizon Cell Tower Update

Ms. Vanderslice noted she had not yet received the photos taken from the individual properties. Expected to receive information in January.

3. Recognition of Actions by Town Departments and Town Organizations Resulting in Wilton's SustainableCT Silver Award

Ms. Vanderslice noted the attached spreadsheet had been prepared in response to Mr. Nabulsi's suggestion of a celebration to recognize the award and recognize the work of the town employees, boards and commissions and organizations that generated the award. As the Town does not typically hold such a celebration, the members agreed to consider if and what accomplishments should be considered for celebration.

4. POCD Implementation Status

Mr. Nabulsi provided a review of his suggested process to review the status of the implantation of the POCD. Members were in agreement. Mr. Nubulsi to execute against the first step of creating a draft letter and implementation spreadsheet to be distributed to each chair. Town Administrator Matt Knickerbocker agreed to follow-up with Milone & MacBroom to assist Mr. Nubulsi.

5. FY2023 Conveyance Revenue

Ms. Vanderslice noted the Town received approximately \$100,000 in conveyance fees related to sales of two large commercial properties. She suggested in a few months, once the members have more information about other revenues, the board might consider assigning those two specific fees to fund a project.

6. Possible Appointment to Fill a Vacancy on the Historic District & Historic Property (HDHP) Commission

Ms. Vanderslice noted the board received an application for Jacob (Jake) Bittner for appointment to the HDHP Commission. She noted Jake was an architect, a background preferred for the Commission and Jake was known to the community as he had won election to the P&Z Commission in 2019, but was not able to be seated due to the minority representation laws. After review and discussion with the Board, motion moved by Mr. Nabulsi to appoint Jacob (Jake) Bittner to the HDHP Commission as a regular member. Motion seconded by Mr. Cole and carried 5-0.

Ms. Vanderslice noted the HDHP planned to begin work towards bringing a proposal to P&Z and the Board to revise the current demolition ordinance to extend the demolition delay from 90-180 days. Such a change would require a vote at the Annual Town Meeting. Ms. Vanderslice asked the members their thoughts on prioritizing such for the meeting. Members expressed concern about the volume of work currently before P&Z, including that which was previously prioritized by the Board. Ms. Vanderslice agreed to discuss with P&Z Chair Tomasetti and report back.

 - Ms. Vanderslice noted Michael Wrinn was contacted by the Government Liaison of the CT Planners Association Executive Committee. The individual Association's priorities received and discussed at the Board's previous meeting were a draft.
 - Ms. Vanderslice reviewed the possible local and legislative land use proposals for Wilton Center and the area of the Wilton Center Train Station as discussed in her December 2022 update available on the town website.
 - Ms. Vanderslice shared details of a WestCOG meeting held with legislators to provide the COG's priorities in advance of the 2023 session.
