

#### B. Discussion and/or Action

#### 1. Ambler Farm – Budget Presentation

Neil Glucklin Former president of Friends of Ambler Farm presented the FY 2017 budget for the organization. Mr. Clune recused himself from discussion due to his relationship to Executive Director Robin Clune. Mr. Dubow and Mr. Kaelin thanked all for the work being done by the Friends of Ambler Farm and its many volunteers.

#### 2. Social Services - Budget Presentation

Cathy Pierce, Director Social Services presented the FY 2017 Social and Senior Services Budget Requests.

#### 3. NRVT MOU & Vendor Contracts

Pat Sesto-Chairman of the NRVT Steering Committee reviewed the MOU and vendor contracts. Wilton Town Counsel and Norwalk Town Counsel has reviewed the contract. Ms. Sesto reviewed what NRVT is and stated that it is a five-town cooperative that is building a 38-mile loop trail connecting Norwalk to Danbury. She reviewed the MOU between Wilton and Norwalk regarding a section of the trail that runs from the commuter lot at Wolfpit Rd down to Grist Mill in Norwalk and pertains to a \$1.1 Million grant offered by DEEP that will help fund 80% of the project. Wilton signed on to host the grant with Wilton and Norwalk responsible for raising 20% in kind services, or \$275,000. Ms. Sesto also reviewed the vendor contracts that would allow work to start on the next section of the trail, a 230ft. long boardwalk at the north end near Twin Oak Lane. Mr. Kaelin made a motion to authorize the First Selectman to execute the NRVT MOU and vendor contracts as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Clune and unanimously carried.

#### 4. Proposed Change for Wetland Disturbance Fee

Ms. Vanderslice reviewed the proposed change for Wetland Disturbance Fee (memo attached). Ms. Vanderslice noted that the fee change was supported by the Inland Wetlands Commission and the Town Planner. Motion made by Mr. Kaelin to approve the proposed change for the Inland Wetlands Disturbance Fee. Motion seconded by Mr. Clune and unanimously carried.

#### 5. <u>Legal Services Town of Wilton</u>

Ms. Vanderslice reviewed the retainer agreement with Town Counsel through end of FY 2016. Motion made by Mr. Kaelin to authorize the First Selectman to execute the retainer agreement with Town Counsel. Motion seconded by Mr. Clune and unanimously carried.

Revised Fee Schedule

In October 2015, the Inland Wetlands Commission received a letter from Kevin O'Brien of O'Brien Premier Properties, LLC requesting the Commission review and reduce the application fees for wetland permit applications. Mr. O'Brien's point was that some projects have been charged excessively large fees for work being proposed outside of the Commission's regulated area. The fees are generally meant to cover the cost of staff time to review and act upon the application as well as the cost of certified mailings, publications of notices and decisions, and project monitoring and compliance.

The Inland Wetlands Commission held a public hearing on Thursday, January 14, 2016 to discuss the fee schedule and allow for public comment on the matter. The Commission discussed a change to reduce the amount of fees collected on large projects, which will bring the fees closer to those of surrounding municipalities.

Following the close of the public hearing, the Commission approved an amended fee schedule and directed staff to forward the schedule to the Board of Selectman for consideration and approval. Attached you will find a copy of the current fee schedule, a fee comparison table and the proposed fee schedule.

Finally, the Commission advises the Board of Selectman to not return any previously collected application fees in order to maintain a fair and consistent interpretation and implementation of Wilton's Inland Wetlands and Watercourse Regulations.

Re: FY 2016 Financial Reporting-December

Forecasting by department has been added as a component of our monthly financial reporting. You will be receiving the detailed December report including the forecast by email at the end of the week.

In the meantime I wanted to share an overview of the FY 2016 forecast versus budget.

FY 2016 revenues are currently forecasted at \$121,491,934 or \$965,876 higher than budget. Additional revenues are due to \$943,000 of proceeds from the sale of assets, primarily the Danbury Road property plus \$50,000 of anticipated additional supplemental motor vehicle fees off set by a \$25,000 of anticipated shortfall in recording fees due to declines in the number of properties sold and mortgages being refinanced.

FY 2016 BOS operating expenses are currently forecasted at \$30,858,000 or \$331,000 less than the budget. Savings are due to a reduced need for consultants for labor negotiations, delays in filling open positions, reductions in employee benefit costs including workman's compensation and energy savings. Savings are forecasted to be offset by overspending of \$110,000 in legal costs and agency placement fees.

Operating Capital is forecasted to be unchanged and Charter Authority is forecasted to be unused.
