Dear Mr. Carlino:

We appreciate the continued coordination your staff has had with us regarding the design development for State Project 0173-0510. We have reviewed the enclosed preliminary traffic signal plan and understand the construction and post-construction project impacts to Horseshoe Park as detailed on the plan.

We understand that all impacts to Horseshoe Park for purposes of this project will have no anticipated adverse physical impacts, nor will there be interference with the projected activities, features, or attributes of the property, on either a permanent or temporary basis. We understand that the following work will occur on the southeast corner of Horseshoe Park:

Southeast Corner of Horseshoe Park (northwest corner of intersection):

- Removal of the existing 4'-6" pedestal with pedestrian pushbutton
- Installation of two new 8' pedestals with pedestrian signal equipment
- Removal of existing sidewalk ramp
- Construction of two new sidewalk ramps

A permanent easement will be required for the installation and future maintenance of traffic control signal equipment with pedestrian signals and push buttons as well as reconstruction of sidewalk ramps.

The Town of Wilton concurs that the use of the park will not adversely affect any activities or features that make the park eligible for preservation under Section 4(f) of the US DOT Act. The Town supports CTDOT's use of the park for the purposes of the project.
