WILTON – State Project 0173-0510 will upgrade the traffic control signal equipment and pedestrian control features at the intersection of Route 106 (Wolf Pit Road), Horseshoe Road, and Range Road which will meet the latest Federal Guidelines. It should be noted that the intersection abuts Horseshoe Park. However, impacts to the park will be minimal (de minimis) in nature as the aforementioned upgrades at the intersection will be constructed in close proximity to the existing traffic control signal appurtenances.

An easement is required from the Town for park property which will encompass only the area necessary for sidewalk ramp reconstruction and the installation of traffic control pedestrian signal equipment. These activities will not adversely affect any of the features of the park. The impacts to the park will be limited to only the ground disturbance necessary for installing traffic signal equipment and constructing sidewalk ramps in proximity to the intersection. It is anticipated that Horseshoe Park will remain open during the period of reconstruction.
