Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 8:05 a.m.

- A. Approval of Minutes: Upon motions duly made and seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the Commission meeting held on September 13, 2017.
- B. Public Comments: No comments made.

#### C. Monthly Reports:

- a. Chief's Report: The Chief's Monthly Reports for October 2017 were reviewed and discussed by the Commission (copy of the Report is attached).
- Deputy Chief's Report: The Deputy Chief's Reports dated October 2017 were reviewed and discussed by the Commission (copy of the Report is attached).
- c. Apparatus Supervisors Report: The Apparatus Supervisors Reports dated September and October 2017 were reviewed (copy of the Report is attached). Apparatus Supervisor Petrizzi reported that the new Engine 1 (Rosenbauer) was put into service on October 31, 2017.

- c. Station 2 Renovation: Commissioner Tartell reported that architect Rob Sanders has drafted alternate plans for the renovation. The Station 2 Building Committee is scheduled to present plans and cost estimates to the Board of Selectmen at the Board's meeting on December 18, 2017.

- a. Automatic Mutual Aid Agreements: Commissioner Healy reported that Chief Kanterman and he will meet with First Selectman Vanderslice to discuss the automatic mutual aid agreements with New Canaan, Georgetown and Weston.
- b. Replacement of Dishwasher at Station 1: Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to pay for the replacement of the dishwasher at Station 1 from the Fire Department Gift Fund.
- F. Public Comment: Commissioner Tartell advised the group that he had the opportunity to take part in an Active Shooter Training program.
- **G.** Adjournment: Upon a motion duly made and seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 8:48 a.m.

- o Total incidents for the month of October 2017 were 131, which is slightly above the prior month and slightly below the prior year.
- Year to date call volume continues to track approximately 5% lower than the prior year, primarily due to the reduced level of EMS calls.
- The significant incidents during the month were as follows:
  - October 15<sup>th</sup> MVA with extrication on Danbury Road at Olmstead Hill Road
  - October 18th Oven fire at 47 Chessor Lane
  - October 22<sup>nd</sup> Responded to New Canaan to provide mutual aid assistance at a structure fire (986 South Avenue)
  - October 30<sup>th</sup> Carbon Monoxide incident at 50 Middlebrook Farm Road

  - CERT Supervision & Activation Paperwork Paperwork for CERT activations during the month was completed and submitted to DEMHS Region 1.
  - CERT/Citizen Corps Attended Citizen Corps and the Statewide Coordinating Committee meetings.
  - FEMA Award
    - We were notified that the Connecticut Citizens Corps
       Council is being awarded the FEMA Outstanding Citizen
       Corps Council Award for 2017. Formal announcements and media releases will take place in the coming weeks.
  - **ATV/UTV** The enclosed trailer was returned to the manufacturer to have the incorrect/missing wiring corrected. It is expected to be returned within the week.

- Meters Assembled quote information and submitted Purchase Order Request for replacement meters. Awaiting PO from the Finance Department.
