

- III. New Business
 - a. COA 50 New Street

Owners presented architectural and property plans for a twostory barn-like structure to be constructed adjacent to their 50 New Street home. There was discussion about specifics of the structure and to determine if commissioners viewed this to be a minor or major change to the property. Due to it's size and location, Sanders made a motion to declare this "major", Follett seconded, all approved. A public hearing will be scheduled for December 6, 2016.

b. Potential New Historic District.

Commissioner Sanders presented information about a potential new historic district located in the region of Ridgefield Road, Millstone Road and Bald Hill. Informational meetings for home owners within the proposed district are being planned. Commissioners will attend to present detail about historic districts, the process to establish and to answer questions about establishing such.

c. Historical Society Grant

The WiltonHistorical Society has been awarded a Connecticut grant of \$30,000 to move to Phase II of the 1989 Cultural Resources Survey. It will focus on evaluating the approximately 350 structures built in Wilton 1920-1940. The grant is also intended to digitize the existing survey. An architectural historian will conduct the survey.

d. Website Updated

Commissioner Fawcett noted that the website has been updated to include a section on the process of establishing historic districts.

- 1. Commissioner Sanders noted that the League of Women Voters is conducting a "mini" investigation into the role of historic districts commissions, historic districts and other ways Connecticut towns handle preservation issues. "What can Wilton Learn?"
