#### MINUTES SPECIAL MEETING

#### Wilton Parks & Recreation Commission March 1, 2022 / 8:00 PM Virtual Meeting via Zoom

- I. Call to Order Bilella called meeting to order at 8:02 pm.
- II. Requesting ARPA and Infrastructure Funds for P&R Project Priorities discussion and/or action
  - Bilella summarized the purpose of this meeting, which is for P&R Commission in unison with P&R to agree upon an approach to requesting funds and to put forward a request to the BOS on March 7th for funding from the American Rescue Plan grant & BOS Infrastructure Fund.
  - Bilella provided background including the funding available and the Town's already-defined key priorities of an emergency communications system (\$3-4M) and WHS Complex mitigation/new drainage plan (amount TBD). To date, Conservation Commission provided requests to BOS for several projects (totaling approximately \$470K). P&R will present a request to BOS on March 7<sup>th</sup>. Facilities Director will provide requests for town-owned building needs on March 21<sup>st</sup>. Also at the March 21<sup>st</sup> BOS meeting, Smeriglio will present the findings and recommendations for the WHS Complex mitigation/new drainage plan.
  - Guidance provided no one department will get approval for all requests.
  - Pierce provided a chart of high-level estimated costs for the P&R Priority Projects List for the Commissioners to use in their decision-making process/recommendation for request.
  - P&R Commission discussed with Pierce and Smeriglio the chart and project list, how to approach the funding request, and put forward a recommendation.
    - List of P&R Priority Projects under consideration was based on the previous list submitted in November 2021 to BOS, minus the WHS Complex mitigation/new drainage plan, which is already earmarked, are the following (in priority order):
      - 1. Improve Drainage and Address Irrigation Across All Fields with Potential Issues
      - 2. New Turf Field with Lights
      - 3. Upgrades to Merwin Meadows Complex
      - 4. Dome/Indoor Field House at Comstock
      - 5. Enhancing/Upgrading Existing Fields
      - 6. Dog Park
  - Commission recommended the following:
    - Phase 1 of Improved Drainage and Irrigation Project: \$705K. Rationale: The Middlebrook complex (made up of five fields) has most critical need for drainage and irrigation to preserve these Town assets.
    - Portion of Funds for New Turf Field with Lights: \$200K for design + \$500K earmarked for new turf field construction totaling \$700K. Rationale: This is a highly desired and needed amenity. Having both design and some portion of

- construction allocated shows good faith to the community thus, inspiring and enabling private fundraising with some certainty of completion
- Phase 1 of Upgrades to Merwin Meadows Complex: \$250K for 5-12 age playground with new fence. Rationale: this area is heavily used year-round and has a critical need for replacement due to significant degrading of fencing and key structures in the play area.
- Guglielmo made a motion to approve the recommendation, Kendra seconded. Approved 5-0-0.
