### **Training**

- Monthly training topics covered were ice rescue classroom and practical (Merwin Meadows), Multiple gas/PID/radiation meter review via PowerPoint (created by Capt. Wilson, Capt. Czarnecki and FF Mandel), members took a hazmat/meter quiz created by Capt. Locher and a practical metering and hazmat scenarios were done.
- SOP's/SOG's covered this month were 308, 502, 503, 504, 602 and 605
- Monthly EMS training topic for the month is START Triage being taught by Harry Downs of Norwalk Hospital.
- 6 department members completed a Respirator Train the Trainer program by Your Home CPR LLC to perform Qualitative Fit testing in accordance with OSHA 1910.134.
- DC Plofkin attended a program presented by CT Transit on the implementation and safety of the new electric CT Transit busses being implemented in the region at their Stamford garage.
- DC Plofkin is working with Capt. Nick Esposito of Truck Tactics to schedule Aerial ladder training for each shift in the month of May.
- FF Sam Guttman was enrolled in a State of CT Pump Operator program through the Fairfield Regional Fire school during April/May 2022.

### **Health and Safety-**

- PS Trax inventories continue to be updated to reflect our actual inventory on all vehicles and is being used to report station deficiencies on a daily basis.
- COVID 19 supplies such as N95 masks, gloves and other prevention materials were restocked by Captain Elliott to ensure our members have protection.

- The fire marshal's office was measured for new fire marshal protective clothing which was delivered this past week.
- Servpro cleaned and decontaminated the upholstered seats and cabs in all of our Engines, the trucks to reduce exposure potential carcinogen exposure to our members.
- DC Plofkin sat in on a records management presentation by First Due regarding fire reporting, pre-fire planning, fire inspections, payroll management and other items.
- Paperwork concerning the PFAS containing firefighting foam disposed of through the State of CT take back plan was received from Clean Harbors confirming disposal.
