Jackie,

Could you please add these to the public distribution and BOF meeting.

The first attachment is the latest available statewide comparisons of spending per student (2020), which shows Wilton spent more per student than Darien, New Canaan, Ridgefield, Easton...and of course Fairfield, Norwalk, and Stamford. In terms of comparable sized schools, Westport spent 2.9% more per student than Wilton. According to their budget proposal to the Westport BOF, they have requested a 4.11% increase on a 1% projected drop in students, but that will drop to 1.79% increase if union members approve their proposed change in medical insurance carriers, as they have been proactively working on RFPs to offset the major cost increases.

The other attachments are extracts of our projected compensation for Wilton teachers vs Darien teachers, as just one example of how we compare to another top performing school district. Given that compensation is by far the biggest driver, We should be talking about the absolute pay scale and trends in Wilton relative to surrounding towns.

Lastly, we should discuss the soon to arrive grants from the \$1.9 trillion stimulus package/ American Rescue Act. According to articles on the subject, CT government will receive \$4.3 Billion of that...\$130 billion nationally for k-12 relief. Of that, \$1,641 Billion was earmarked for "Local Aid" in CT. Wilton spends 0.1% of the total Education spend of \$8,999 Million spent in CT in 2020 NCE. If there was a purely mathematical calculation based on NCE, Wilton would get \$14.8 MM of those funds. Somehow, I'm guessing it will not work that way, but it could be a significant grant... I have heard a seven figure amount for Wilton schools, which could be used, depending on any rules for use, to effectively pay COVID related expenses and either to reduce the burden on tax payers, fund debt sinking fund, or fund capital projects. worth discussing as part of the budget discussions, and the mil rate model. Looking forward to our discussions.
