Hi Steve, I would like you to present to the board Wilton's need to build dedicated, lighted Pickleball courts. As you may have read, Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in America. Some of the reasons include the easy learning curve to play, low equipment costs, and rules that encourage player engagement. This is a sport that can be enjoyed by all ages and the surrounding towns are well aware of this. Westport, Norwalk, New Canaan, Ridgefield and Darien have all built dedicated Pickleball courts for their residents. Lighted courts would also allow residents who work during the day to still enjoy playing in the evening, just like the High School tennis courts. While Wilton recently adding Pickleball lines to 4 MiddleBrook tennis courts was a noble effort, many times these courts are taken by tennis players which reduces availability to Pickleball players.
