Frequently Asked Questions

Who administers the program?

The Wilton Tree Committee, which is a subcommittee of the Wilton Conservation Commission.

How much does it cost?

The program costs \$1,000 for a donation. This covers the cost to purchase and plant the tree or shrubs and maintain them for three years. In addition, it includes an engraved brick, which is placed at the base of the tree or shrubs indicating its species, donor, and the name of the person being honored.

Who selects the trees and shrubs?

Donors have the option of selecting a shade tree, understory tree, or group of shrubs. Based on this preference, the Wilton Tree Committee determines the specific plant species based on a number of factors. These include the plant's growth requirements, life expectancy, and size at maturity, as well as site specific factors including the amount of available space, aesthetics, foot traffic, public access, and safety.

Where will my donated tree or shrubs be planted?

The Wilton Tree Committee will select an appropriate location in town in accordance with the current Master Plan for Wilton.

When will my tree or shrubs be planted?

Plants are generally installed in the fall to help ensure their establishment with the least environmental or seasonal stresses. The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago.

All Donated Plants Will be Native Species

Native plants are those that have grown in a particular area since before human settlement. They have adapted to the habitat they live in and offer essential benefits to the ecosystem — stabilizing soil, filtering water, purifying air, and supporting wildlife. For homeowners, they provide numerous advantages over non-native plants:

- ✓ Refuge for Wildlife. They are naturally programmed to produce fruit, nectar, seeds, and nuts when it's needed by the wildlife that reside in the area. By providing an ideal habitat for wildlife, they are a magnet for butterflies, birds and beneficial insects.
- ✓ Soil and Water Conservation. With lush foliage and extensive root systems, native plants hold water better than non-native plants. They adapt to the typical amount of precipitation an area receives, thereby helping to prevent flooding and soil erosion.
- ✓ **Lower Maintenance.** Since native plants are adapted to the specific climate of the region, they have a built-in defense system that makes them naturally more resistant to disease, drought, and pests than nonnative plants. As a result, they require no pesticides and use less water and fertilizer to thrive.
