# **OVERVIEW**

#### **GOALS**

The goals of this Plan are to:

- Provide a road map to the reopening of all Town of Wilton owned buildings and facilities.
- Provide a road map to ensure the safety of all Town residents and employees who utilize or work in Town owned buildings and facilities.

# **PRIORITIES**

A number of factors must be considered when determining access to building and facilities, when, how and if to provide Town services, and required staffing levels during the Coronavirus pandemic. The following priorities will guide decision making:

- The health and safety of the public and Town employees.
- Providing sufficient and effective public emergency services, including Police, Fire and EMS.
- Providing sufficient and effective essential services to residents, including health and social services.
- Providing essential internal services, including finance and information services.
- Providing assistance to Wilton businesses and nonprofits.
- Providing assistance to Wilton families, including childcare services.

## **EMPLOYEE SAFETY**

Multiple strategies will be utilized to minimize risks to the health of Town of Wilton employees:

- Adequate and appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Enhanced and frequent cleaning.
- Social distancing and physical barriers within the work areas.
- Restricted and controlled public access to the building, including by appointment only services and use of drop boxes for services.
- Increased availability of online services and resources.
- Staggered shifts.
- Cross-training between departments.
- Working remotely.

#### RESIDENT SAFETY

Multiple strategies will be utilized to minimize risks to the health of Town of Wilton residents:

- Social distancing and physical barriers within the visitor areas.
- By appointment only services and use of drop boxes for services.
- Increased availability of online services and resources.

• Enhanced and frequent cleaning.

#### STATE OF CT GUIDELINES

The Town of Wilton will follow the Governor's Executive Orders and the guidelines set forth by the Governor and the State Departments regarding reopening. Those would include but not be limited to the use of face coverings or masks, reduced capacity, restriction on the size of gatherings, and physical distancing.

The Town of Wilton will be following the State of Connecticut Reopening Phases, with Phase 1 being the most restrictive to Phase 4 being the least restrictive. Those found in violation of these guidelines may be subject to enforcement measures. State guidelines are subject to change and may be adjusted based on the current health situation.

#### **COMMUNITY WIDE GUIDELINES**

The Town of Wilton encourages the public to continue practicing good hygiene by washing hands well and frequently, avoiding touching your face, and avoiding close contact with people who are sick. Those who feel sick must stay home and stay away from others in the household. Individuals should always cover a cough or sneeze with a tissue and then throw it away.

Please clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces. Those who are at increased risk, including those age 65 and older and those with serious underlying health conditions are strongly encouraged to continue sheltering in place until further notice.

#### **BUSINESSES and NONPROFITS**

The Town of Wilton Reopening Plan is for municipal facilities and services. Businesses and non-profits are advised to follow the State of Connecticut guidelines.

The Town of Wilton Reopening Plan is subject to review and may change depending on local conditions.

# RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

Private Gathering Size Restrictions (subject to social distancing and sector rules): 25 people indoors, 100 people outdoors.

#### • Town of Wilton Trails

- o Hours of Operation: Open.
- O Additional Details: Face covering required if can't maintain 6-feet of distance from others and medical condition allows while walking/hiking/running/biking. Observe trail rules.

#### • WHS/RT 7 Tennis Courts

- o Hours of Operation: Open
- o Access: Walk on
- Restrictions: Wilton residents only. USTA Coronavirus rules of play only. No teams. Phase 1 sign-ups honored through June 21<sup>st</sup>.

#### • Middlebrook Tennis Courts

- o Hours of Operation: Closed
- o Access: Parks and Recreation and Continuing Education tennis lessons only.

# • WHS Stadium/Lilly Turf Field/All Town Fields

- o Hours of Operation: Daily
- Access: As of June 17<sup>th</sup>, no team play except for approved official Wilton sport groups.
- Wilton Sports Groups: As of June 17th, subject to Phase 2 sector rules and Health Director approval. Documented plan required. Submit draft plans to <a href="mailto:steve.pierce@wiltonct.org">steve.pierce@wiltonct.org</a> for submission to the Health Director.
- Restrictions: No benches, goals or nets provided by the Town of Wilton. Events limited to two teams, officials and limited family members. Stadium seating and stairs closed.

#### WHS Stadium Track

- o Hours of Operation: Daily
- o Access: As of June 17th, no team play, except for approved official Wilton sports groups.
- o Wilton Sports Groups: As of June 17th, subject to Phase 2 DECD sector rules and Health Director approval.

- Documented plan required. Submit plans to steve.pierce@wiltonct.org for submission to the Health Director.
- Restrictions: Face covering required if can't maintain 6-feet of distance from others and medical condition allows while on and off the track. Events limited to two teams, officials and limited family members. Stadium seating and stairs closed.

#### • All Baseball and Softball Fields

- o Hours of Operation: Daily
- Access: As of June 17<sup>th</sup>, no team play, except for approved Wilton sports groups.
- o Wilton Sports Groups: As of June 17th, subject to Phase 2 DECD sector rules and Health Director approval. Documented plan required. Submit plans to <a href="mailto:steve.pierce@wiltonct.org">steve.pierce@wiltonct.org</a> for submission to the Health Director.
- o Restrictions: Events limited to two teams, officials and limited family members. Dugouts closed.

#### WHS Lacrosse Wall

- o Hours of Operation: Daily
- o Access: As of June 17<sup>th</sup>.
- o Restrictions: One player per side of wall.

#### Merwin Meadows

- o Hours of Operation: Daily
- o Access: As of June 20th. Maximum Capacity of 100. Wilton residents only. Check in with attendant, when on duty.
- Restrictions: No lifeguards, no bathhouse, no pavilion, no benches, no picnic tables, no grills, no playground. Face covering required if can't maintain 6-feet of distance from others and medical condition allows or if not under 2 years old. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- Oue to the COVID-19 pandemic, there are no lifeguards at the park. Lifeguarding can require mouth to mouth contact and other close contact, which can spread the COVID-19 virus and create a health risk to the individuals involved and the Wilton Community at large. If you swim or allow your child to swim, you do so at your own risk.

#### • Town and School Basketball Courts

- o Access: As of June 17<sup>th</sup>: summer camp only. As of July 6<sup>th</sup>: open, except when used by summer camp.
- o Restrictions: Comstock Courts closed to public during summer camp hours.

- o Hours of Operation: Closed

# • Comstock Community Center Parking Lots and School Parking Lots

o Locations: All

o Access: Unrestricted
