Veterans Memorial to be Dedicated November 11

On Thursday, November 11, at 10:00 a.m., the Veterans Memorial Green, honoring all Wiltonians who have given their lives in service to

their country, will be dedicated at the intersection of Old Ridgefield Road and Center Street. Veterans will meet at the library and march to the Memorial for the Veterans Day Ceremony and the Veterans Memorial Green Dedication. The ceremony will conclude at 11:00 a.m. with raising of the flag and playing of taps.

Since the French and Indian War, Wilton men and women have fought in our country's wars, bringing honor to our town as they did. This memorial will provide a central place to pay homage to their sacrifice.

The memorial consists of six granite monuments inscribed with the names of Wilton's honored war dead, a bluestone plaza, and a lighted flagpole from which the American flag will fly day and night.

WILTON COMMONS VOTE ON NOVEMBER 30

On October 4, the Board of Selectmen approved the extension of the option to lease 4.8 acres of land to Wilton Commons until December 8, 2011. With the downturn in the economy, funding has been difficult to obtain. However, Wilton Commons has made significant progress in the past three months toward meeting the conditions in the option agreement. We expect to start the closing process for funding with the state agencies and the tax credit investor as we approach the current deadline of December 8, 2010.

In addition to approval by the Selectmen, the one -year option extension requires approval by a Special Town Meeting which will be held on Tuesday, November 30, 7:30 p.m., at Middlebrook School. <u>There will be no Saturday vote</u>. Please attend and vote "Yes" for the extension of the Option Agreement until December 8, 2011. Be sure to have personal identification with you.

Memory Screening on November 1 and 16

On Monday, November 1, Visiting Nurse & Hospice of Fairfield County and the Wilton Senior Center will sponsor free one-on-one, confidential memory screening from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Wilton Senior Center. Screenings will take place by appointment only. For more information or to make an appointment, contact Jeanette Graham, Life Care Coordinator at Visiting Nurse & Hospice, at 203-762-8958 ext. 249. Another opportunity for memory screening will take place on Tuesday, November 16, at Laurel Ridge Health Care Center, 642 Danbury Road, Ridgefield, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. To schedule your appointment or for more information, call Laurel Ridge at 203-438-8226. These confidential memory screenings are offered free of charge as a community service.

Why is memory screening important?

Memory screening is a first step toward identifying Alzheimer's disease, related dementia, and other conditions that cause memory loss. Memory screening may put your fears to rest when results turn out normal. A normal memory screening score also establishes a baseline for future comparison. The re-

For information contact Alan Gould at 203-762-8269. sults of the memory screening do not represent a diagnosis of any particular illness. Screening does not replace consultation with a qualified healthcare professional.

Memory may be affected by a number of factors, including stress, lack of sleep, Alzheimer's disease, vascular dementia, vitamin deficiencies, depression, and thyroid problems. Some conditions are reversible. In general, the earlier the diagnosis, the easier it is to treat. Early recognition of mild cognitive impairment provides an opportunity for healthcare professionals to treat the condition and possibly slow the decline in memory and other functions.

A memory screening is a simple, safe evaluation tool that takes five to ten minutes to administer. It consists of a series of questions and/or tasks designed to test memory, language skills, thinking ability and other intellectual functions.

Results of the memory screenings are confidential. Ask for a copy of the screening results to bring to your healthcare professional.

MEDICARE PART D INFORMATION APPOINTMENTS

On Thursday, November 18, representatives from the Southwestern Connecticut Agency on Aging will be at the Senior Center meeting with individuals regarding the Medicare Part D prescription drug program. Appointments between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. are available for any Medicare beneficiary who has Medicare Part A or Part B or both. <u>November is the time to get the help you need to choose or change your prescription drug plan.</u> Please call Sharon Powers at 203-834-6238 to schedule an appointment.

This is your window of opportunity to enroll in or change your Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage program. The **Annual Enrollment period is from November 15 to December 31**. Enrollment in Part D is optional, but if you do not sign up when you are first eligible and change your mind later, you may have to pay a penalty of higher premium. There are exceptions. When you first become eligible for Medicare, you may enroll in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan the first day you become eligible for Part A or part B. You may also enroll in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan when you first become eligible for low-income subsidy (Extra Help).

UPCOMING FLU CLINICS

Flu vaccine clinics are open to anyone age three years or older. No appointment is necessary. Cost for flu vaccine is \$38. Medicare, Anthem, Aetna, cash or check will be accepted. Pneumonia vaccine is also available for persons age 65 and older who have not received the vaccine since reaching age 65. Cost is \$60. Pneumonia vaccine is billable to Medicare Part B. The Computer Learning Center offers computer classes specifically designed for adults. Come and experience computer learning in a fun, stimulating and comfortable environment at the Senior Center.

Introduction to Computer Fundamentals

This introductory course is for those with limited or no computer experience who would like to test the waters. It will include turning the computer on and off, using the mouse and keyboard, understanding the meaning of simple computer terms, opening and closing a program, and using the desktop. This is excellent preparation for Introduction to Word 2007.

Introduction to Word 2007

Step into the present to acquaint yourself with the Word 2007 program. It has a different appearance from the Word version you may have been using. The familiar toolbars and menus from previous versions of Word are gone! This course will explore the Word Window, Office Button, Terminology, Ribbon Organization, Quick Access Toolbar, Document views, plus commonly used features in Word. You will learn how to do the same things you've always done such as entering, changing, deleting, copying, pasting, underlining, aligning, saving, as well as inserting a bullet or number in text in a Word 2007 environment. (Guide and practice sheets included.)

Word 2007 Graphics featuring how to use the ribbon. (Word 2007 familiarity needed.) You will be amazed at what you can create! A quick review will cover the Office Button, Terminology, Ribbon Organization, Office Clipboard, Quick Access Toolbar,

COMPUTER CENTER INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Meals on Wheels of Wilton is a not-for-profit organization which serves our community by providing nourishing meals for those Wilton residents of any age who are not able to take care of their own nutritional needs because they are sick, homebound, handicapped, convalescing, frail, or for any other reason.

Dedicated volunteers deliver a hot and/or cold meal at noontime every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Double meals may be delivered to those clients requiring prepared food six days a week. Low fat, low salt, and other special diets are prepared by the dietary staff of Wilton Meadows Health Care Center in accordance with individual health wishes and/or instructions from physicians.

The current fee is \$3.50 per hot meal and \$1.75 per cold meal. No one is refused because of

financial reasons. We encourage referrals from physicians and other health professionals. We welcome inquiries from anyone who may need our service and from relatives, friends, or neighbors. While we request 24-hour notice to begin or stop service, we are here to assist clients on either a short- or long-term basis.

Devoted volunteers are the integral foundation of our organization. Most drivers deliver once a month, but some are on our substitute list and deliver only occasionally. Life on the Mississippi by Mark Twain
