Hi Jackie,

Here are some more tree ordinances:

— Tree Protection Ordinance for Lattingtown, NY, a hamlet within Locust Valley on Long Island. Prohibits cutting down deciduous trees that exceed 25 inches in circumference or evergreens that exceed 15 inches. Can't remove more than 12 trees during any 12-month period without a permit. — Tree Code for Sands Point, NY. Can't cut down a tree with a trunk circumference greater than 20 inches without a permit. Can't cut down a tree on unimproved land without a permit. Here's the link:

— Tree Code for Great Neck, NY. Can't cut down a tree more than 6 inches in diameter without a permit. Here's the link:

— Tree Code for Muttontown, NY. Can't cut down a tree with a trunk diameter of 7 inches or more or circumference of 22 inches. Can't remove small trees, shrubs, or ground cover on a steep slope without a permit. Can't remove a rare or endangered tree, shrub or ground-cover without a permit. Here's the link:

— Tree Code for Millburn Township, NJ, which includes Short Hills, NJ. Can't cut down a tree having a diameter greater than 10 inches without a permit. Can't cut down specimen and historic trees without a permit. Here's the link:
